CUSTOMS & E-COMMERCE

Although e-commerce is generally confined to the world of business and consumers, it has an impact on vital interactions between business and government, particularly with respect to millions of cargo, vessel and passenger movements that are managed globally each day. The WCO's e-commerce strategy highlights the use of e-commerce which is used for supply chain management, bilateral and multilateral cooperation, and as a single window for international transactions. The WCO Data Model and the Unique Consignment Reference in turn act as key implementation tools.

WCO DATA MODEL

The WCO Data Model provides a maximum framework of standardised and harmonised sets of data and standard electronic messages to be submitted by the Trade to Customs and other regulatory bodies in order to accomplish formalities relating to the arrival, departure, transit and release of goods, crew and means of transport in international cross-border trade. This single electronic structure enables the more effective exchange of information within Customs and between administrations and its stakeholders.

THE UNIQUE CONSIGNMENT REFERENCE

The UCR is a reference which identifies a commercial transaction from initial order through to final delivery. Its main objective is to define a generic mechanism that has sufficient flexibility to cope with the most common scenarios that occur in international trade. Its basis is to make maximal use of existing supplier, customer and transport references. It is also intended to provide continuity of the audit trail from destination to source which will facilitate the move to more auditbased controls.

E-LEARNING

The World Customs Centre of Learning's range of e-learning programs is dedicated to expanding your grasp of international customs rules. It is designed to provide users with the necessary understanding of both core and key instruments and associated tools.
